


Motivation

- The dataset used for this research covers 184 elections in 29 European countries for the time span from 1986 to 2014.

Main findings (1)

- More growth leads to a lower vote share for populist parties (on both ends of the political spectrum).
- > A nonlinear relationship between growth and populist support, especially for left-wing parties.
- > An increase in unemployment seems to raise the vote share for left-wing populist parties (at 5% significance level), but is not significant in the model for support of right-wing parties.



Main findings (2)

- > Asylum seekers have different impact on populist support (negative for left, positive for right).
- > A higher level of unemployment and asylum seekers increases the vote share of left-wing populist parties.
- > Increase on the index for globalization raises the populist vote share slightly.
