# 1. To what extent in Europe forged in crisis?

### Monnet's Mantra: Europe Forged in Crisis

This, because in addition to its benefits – freedom of movement for people, goods, services and capital – the single market also increases the interdependence among national economies and fuels the feeling that we need "to act together." That is especially important today when, in each of our countries' grass-roots opinions, the globalisation process is frightening people and populism is gaining ground, urging countries to turn in on themselves. That is why elected governments have a tendency to assign priority to purely national interests, forgetting the benefits of shared sovereignty. This interdependence in the market is a kind of plinth, a base which, even if the climate were to deteriorate in the future, would still make it possible to keep the construction of Europe alive.





Figure 9.3 Party family vote shares in western Europe, 1919–2019





## Politicizing International Cooperation: The Mass Public, Political Entrepreneurs, and Political Opportunity Structures

Catherine E. De Vries, Sara B. Hobolt, and Stefanie Walter

Abstract International institutions are increasingly being challenged by domestic opposition and nationalist political forces. Yet, levels of politicization differ significantly across countries facing the same international authority as well as within countries over time. This raises the question of when and why the mass public poses a challenge to international cooperation. In this article, we develop a theoretical framework for understanding the nature and implications of politicization of international cooperation, outlining three scope conditions: the nature of public contestation, the activities of political entrepreneurs, and the permissiveness of political opportunity structures. By empirically examining these scope conditions, we demonstrate that politicization can have both stabilizing and destabilizing effects on international cooperation. Highlighting the systemic implications of politicization for international cooperation has important implications for international relations scholarship. Although international organizations may face challenges, they also have ways of being remarkably resilient.










Figure 5.6 Vote shares for populist parties across Europe, 1993–2022











## Public Support for European Security

- Despite Europe's resilience, concerns are growing that **economic costs** could weaken public support for Ukraine and **undermine Europe's ability to act in unity**.
- This concern is mounting given the **recent pivot** of the Trump administration.
- As a result, the link between security, economic concerns & European public opinion on foreign policy is now a critical concern for scholars & policymakers.



Closeness to Moscow Increases Threat Perception and Support for Defence Cooperation


#### **But What About Economic Concerns?**

- Public opinion for security and foreign policy involvement is not just a function of concerns about security threat perceptions, but due to possible costs of support. Recall German coalition example: **Ukraine support involves tradeoffs.**
- Studying this at micro level is challenging. While Europeans who worry about their economic situation are less likely to support sending weapons to Ukraine, but this is **correlation.**
- Causality could run in the **opposite direction**, i.e. Europeans who oppose EU involvement in Ukraine may be more likely to emphasize economic problems.

### Instrumental Variable Approach


- We study the effect of economic hardship on Europeans' foreign policy attitudes using Eurobarometer (EB) survey data from April 2022 & June 2023.
- We use an **instrumental variable (IV) approach**. Our instrument exploits the interaction between **local temperature fluctuations & national energy price changes**, which affects how salient economic costs are to individuals across different regions & times.
- While rising energy prices generally heighten economic hardship, this effect should be weaker for people experiencing warmer weather, as they consume less energy.
- First stage results show significant effect on respondents' economic concerns.

## **Concluding Remarks**

- Europeans' attitudes on security and foreign policy change over time, display important differences across member states & individuals.
- **Security and economic concerns** shape security and foreign policy attitudes in much the same way as we would predict based on existing work.
- If **public support wanes**, this opens up future political contention & may jeopardise effort to maintain the EU's security.
- In the efforts of increasing European security cooperation and Ukraine support, political leaders should **not forget (perceived) costs for the public.**
- Shifting the core of the European project away from soft power to hard power requires trade offs & sacrifices, leaders need to develop a **narrative about why and how**.
